# Ni sa bula vinaka, or in short, Bula (mboola)



Bula is a Fijian greeting, it is more than a 'Hi'. It translates as 'life', and is usually said with a biggest smile, a life giving greeting. I am Ini Foiakau, from Leigh Fijian Congregation of Parramatta City Uniting, and humbled to be invited by Rev'd Clive Pearson to preach this Sunday.

My family moved to Australia from Fiji about 23 years ago, and in response to hospitality offered we joined Leigh Fijian. I now call myself an Australian-Fijian, I am a wife, a mother of two 2<sup>nd</sup> Gen young wo-men, and a Lay Leader. I was recently elected as one of the Deputy Chairs for the Presbytery, and I am still navigating my way through that. Australia has a lot to offer for latter migrants like me, personally, it is a celebration, it is also an on-going challenge to live in plural worlds. In most things I do, Iam toggling between these worlds. My third identity, which is in Christ is the one that holds my other two worlds together.

## Prayer Matters in John 17:1-11

This Sunday is the 7<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter, the last Sunday of the Easter season.

This season we have celebrated Resurrection and the Ascension of Christ, affirming what we recite in the Apostles Creed, '*He ascended to heaven*'

Next week, is Pentecost, the pouring of the Holy Spirit. How enriching, and sacred are these significant events, even if we don't celebrate it as such, it holds a place in history and the life of the Church.

For the readings this week, the gospel reading of John 17:1-11 speaks out, though complicated and challenging. These few chapters in John, particularly from Chapter 14-17, is part of the Farewell Discourse, a connection between Jesus and his impending departure.

There is a build up of His teachings about His death, there is foot washing, Peter's denial of Jesus, Jesus talking to his disciples that he is the WAY, the TRUTH and the LIFE. He is the TRUE VINE. His giving the new commandment, Love each other just as I have loved you. This marks them as His disciple.

The reflection briefly looks at the following themes:

Does this Prayer Matter. It does because this is Jesus Prayer to His Father

Does this Prayer Matter. It does because it is an expression of God's Love

Does this Prayer Matter. It does because Jesus prays for His Disciples

Does this Prayer Matter. It does because it encourages us to respond, in love and prayer.

There are many ways we can express our love to others, it can be through prayer, and/or service. Jesus did both. As we look forward to the week of Pentecost, let this prayer – Jesus prayer remind us of Jesus Way, and His way is the way of love.
