# Something to think about

## 1st December Advent 1 Hope

#### **Lectionary Readings:**

Jeremiah 33:14-16 Psalm 25:1-10 1 Thessalonians 3:9-13 Luke 21:25-36

#### A New Church Year

This Sunday marks the beginning of a new liturgical year. We will be in the third year of the Revised Common Lectionary three-year cycle, Year C, which focuses on the Gospel of Luke. We begin with the season of Advent. Advent means the arrival or happening of a notable person or thing or an invention being made. Advent is a season of preparation for Christmas, that being the celebratory season commemorating the birth of Jesus, who was the Christ and Immanuel (which means God with us).

This Advent, the Uniting Church Assembly will be sharing a series of reflections under the theme, 'Expanding Advent'. The series has been prepared in recognition that we are living in a time of acute crisis in the Holy Land, the very lands of Jesus' birth. Some communities and worship leaders may be wrestling with the language,

themes and ideas of the Advent season in light of the present war in Palestine, Israel and the wider Middle East. There is all the other issues, problems, and conflicts throughout the world which impinge on our faith and discipleship.

Over the next five weeks the Assembly will offer a range of resources including reflections, art and vigil to enrich our journey through this season of the church.

Offerings will be released weekly:

- Week 1 Introduction and Expanding our Language (released 20 November)
- Week 2 **Expanding our Hearts** (released Wednesday 27 November)
- Week 3 **Expanding our Minds** (released Wednesday 4 December)
- Week 4 **Expanding our Senses** (released Wednesday 11 December)

Week 5 - **Expanding our Hospitality** (released Wednesday 18 December)

As is the tradition in many Churches, we will have an Advent wreath and be lighting Advent candles on each of the four Sundays leading up to Christmas.

Each candle has a traditional meaning of hope, peace, joy and love, with the final candle, the white candle in the middle being the Christ candle which is lit on Christmas Day.

#### A New Church Year -Continued

Hope, peace, joy and love are really lovely ideas. They hold much meaning for many of us, but they are also not always easy words to put into practise. In our lives, as is in the world, there is often a lot which can potentially diminish our hope, rob us of peace, lessen our joy, and separate us from love. We, who are people of faith in God, know (or at least claim) that God is the source of hope, peace, joy and love, and that God in the person of Jesus is the way into these blessings. Yet, it takes some work to work out how that all works. What seems simple actually is not always easy to comprehend.

As we start a new liturgical or Church year, it can seem like we are stuck in an endless cycle. The fun and celebration of Christmas is a highlight, but some of us can wonder what the point is to doing the same thing over and over again. This is understandable, but there is a way to overcome any resistance to this seeming perpetual habit of religious waiting and celebration. The reality is that we need to keep doing it over and over again until it becomes reality.

We need to keep finding hope and ways to bring into being that is real and powerful in our lives. We need to keep working for peace, both in our own lives and in our world, because we humans can't seem to ever live in peace for long. We need joy: joy which is not simple happiness. Joy is a feeling of intense, happiness and contentment that comes from within and is connected to living a more authentic life. It can coexist or be present at the same time as sorrow. It can be momentary as we notice or remember things which give us joy, or it can be a long-lasting foundation which sits in the bedrock of our souls. Finally, we need love. Love, that deep self-giving love, is the thing in life which brings meaning and purpose, but it takes work and effort, and we need to practise it all the time, and be reminded of its power and importance when our loving gets fatigued. For all this, we need God, because we can't always do it on our own.

So, in this season of Advent, where we tread a maybe familiar road, may we find new paths which lead us to new insight. May we look to find how God is awakening in us new understandings of the power of hope, peace, joy and love to transform our living and our world. To do this let us put in some effort to use resources which are available to us and to set aside time, in this most busy of seasons, for reflection and contemplation. After all, it is our connection with God which is what the season of Advent is all about. God takes on the most intimate of connections in the incarnation that we might come to know the good news of how God is at work for good in the world.

Incarnation is the Word but it is also our work. We are called not to simply sit and wait for Christ to come, because we know that as a present reality and truth, but the season of Advent is a reminding and a remembering that we are called to embody, that is incarnate: put into our fleshly existence as humans, hope, peace, joy and love in ways which transform our living and the lives of others. There is not one simple way to do this and no one can tell us how we as individuals must work it out. We have helps and guides, but we have to find the way as we open ourselves to God and be led into deeper faith and discipleship. So, there is quite a lot to think about in Advent.
